### *Education*

Samuel Larbi started his primary school education at Nyarkoma and continued Osenase middle school in 1970. Kwame found it difficult to complete his middle school as his father passed away early, leaving other siblings which could not let their mother to further his schooling.

### *Christianity*

Kwame gave his life to Christ in early 1981 and was baptised into church of Pentecost at Nyarkoma Assembly.

### *Marriage*

He got married to Miss Elizabeth Oteng in 1984 and God blessed them with seven children and grandchildren.

### *Working life*

Samuel became a professional driver in 1974. He first worked with Akwatia mines as labourer. He moved to Koforidua and stayed with his father senior brother Opanin Kofi Yeboah the late in 1974 as transport operator.

He was later employed into Ghana Education Service as driver in 1994, then Ghana Methodist Education Unit and was transferred to Ghana Senior High Secondary School [GHANAS]. He later worked with Compassionate Private School. In all, Kwame was committed to clean the church premises, arrangement of chairs, he saw to it that everything is complete before church service.

### *Sickness*

He got sick and was taken to hospital on the 20th and passed away 21st July 2024. He left behind a wife Miss Elizabeth Oteng and seven children and grandchildren.

A quote you use to say; ***UNTIL YOU SAVE YOURSELF NO ONE IS COMING TO SAVE YOU'***

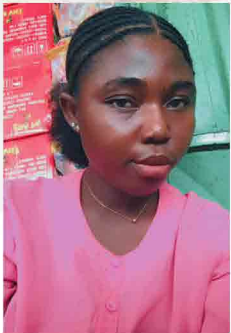
We will keep this in mind always. We never wished for this early exit we wanted you to enjoy the fruit of your labor.

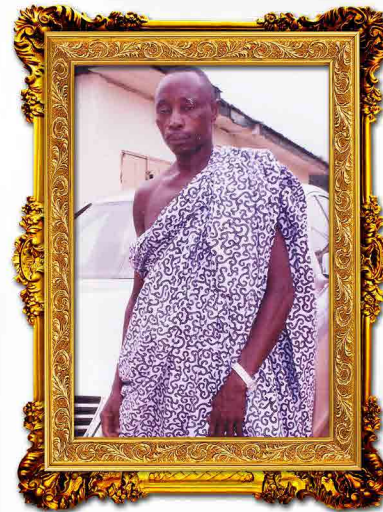
