BIOGRAPHY OF THE LATE ABUSUAPANIN CHRISTIAN SAKYIAMA DAMPARE

And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away. Revelation 21:4 (KJV).

Mr. Christian Sakyiama Dampare was born in Gyakiti on 24/11/1952 in the present-day Asuogyaman District. He was 73 years before he went to be with the Lord on Saturday, the 13th of September, 2025. He was the first son of the two (2) men and eight (8) women that were born to the Late Gyakitihene, Nana Awuah Kofi Dampare, a royal of the Amoakad Royal clan of Gyakiti and his beautiful wife, Oheneba Beatrice Abena Adobea Akoto; an Akwamuheneba from the Abrewa Gyamea family of the Aduana clan of Akwamufie. Wofa Kwadjo, as we affectionately called him, was an Ohenenana of Akwamufie and an Oheneba from Gyakiti. His unique royal heritage and nurture really had much influence in the way he conducted himself.

The hardworking Wofa Kwadjo was brought up in Gyakiti where he attended the Gyakiti L/A School; for his primary and Middle School education. He was studious and respectful in school. These qualities in Wofa Kwadjo enabled him to pursue higher studies for senior civil servants in the Local Government Service at the then Local Government Training School in Accra.

In all, Wofa Kwadjo had five (5) children – two (2) men and three (3) women who are here with us. He took his home serious. Notwithstanding the roles he played in the lives of his wife, children, nieces, nephews and siblings; Wofa Kwadjo took on the honorable role as the head of his extended family - the Abrewa Gyamea family of the Aduana clan of Akwamufie.

Much of his work life was at the local Government Service where he started at the erstwhile KAOGA Assembly. He served as the KAOGA Assembly's paymaster in Somanya; among other very important roles that he played in the executive departments of the local Government Service. When he was there, he found grace and love in Madam Agnes Ofosuwaah from Asante Effiduase who he married and lived with for some time. As life would have it, their love was short-lived. Auntie Agnes died and preceded Wofa Kwadjo to eternity.

Upon the disintegration of the KAOGA into Asuogyaman District assembly and the other assemblies, he was posted as an experienced hand to help steer matters at the Asuogyaman District Assembly.



He was later sent to the Nsawam Adoagyiri Municipality; where he finally retired from active service in 2012. Being the consummate unionist that he was, he was recalled from retirement by the CLOGSAG-TUC and made its Eastern Regional Chairman in Koforidua on a five (5) year post-retirement contract.

After his stint with them he finally bowed out of work for the second time and went back to stay with his family in Akrade.

As he aged, his health began to wane and fail him. This made him to frequently visit hospitals in the Akwamu and Krobo areas. Family and friends did all they could but on Saturday, 13th September, 2025, Wofa Kwadjo responded to his maker's call and succumbed to death. Wofa Kwadjo is survived by his widow, five (5) children, six (6) siblings, nieces and nephews, family and well-wishers who mourn his death in our midst today.

We will always remember him for his love, generosity, and kindness.

His legacy lives on in us, and his memory will forever remain in our hearts.

Together with our mum Mama Ernestina Yaa Kesewaa, your extended family, loved ones here and abroad, we say thank you for all that you taught and did for us.


Dada Christian Kwadwo Sakyiama Dampare. We love you and will miss you every single day.



Arh death you have really scattered us, wo di na medi wake up wo nom na me nom.



