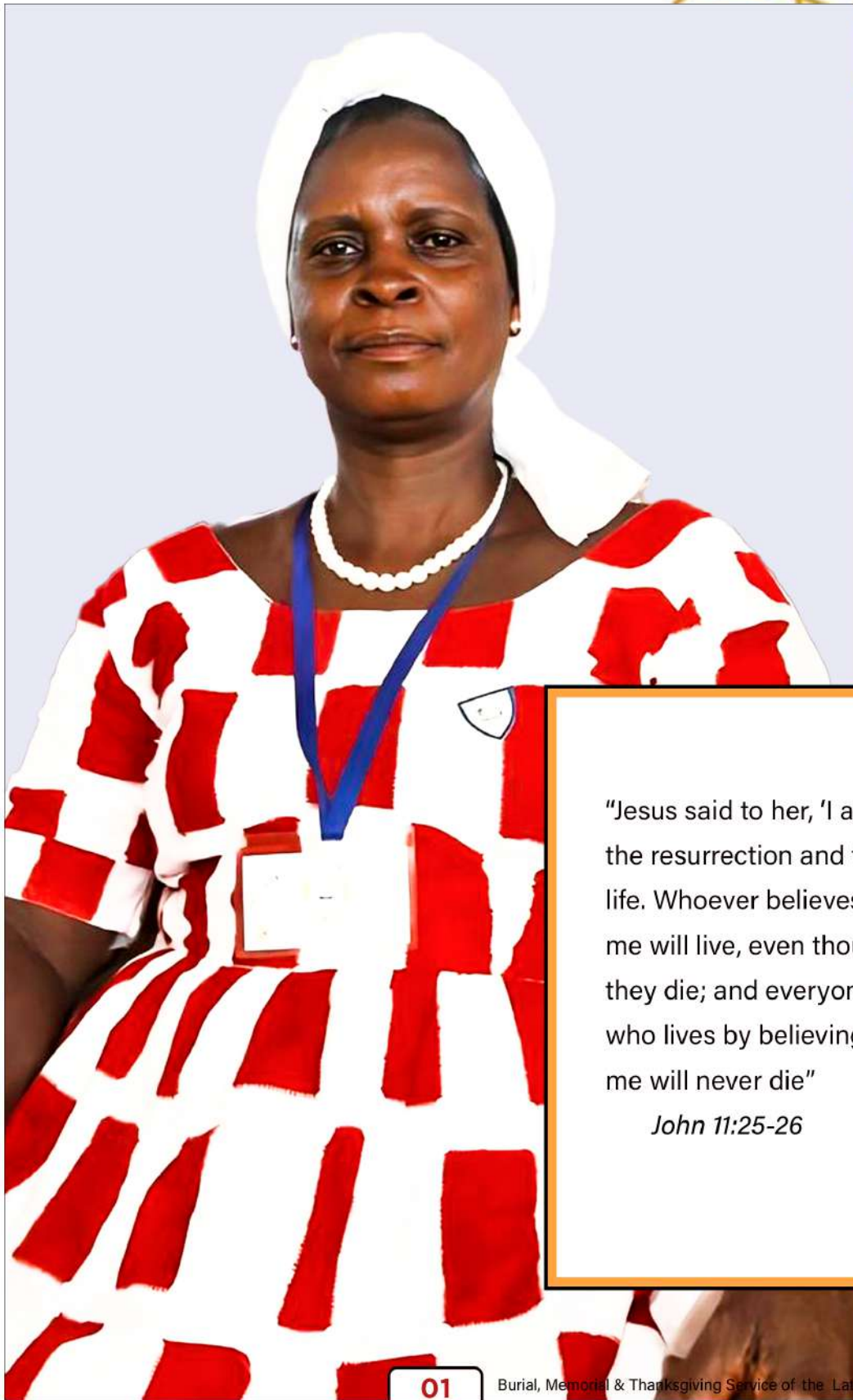

IN LOVING MEMORY OF *Obaapanin* Emma Asaa Appeaning

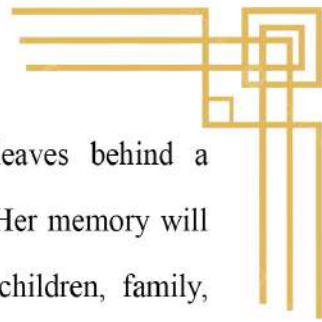
*"When I lie down, I go to sleep in peace; you alone,

Madam Emma Asaa Appeaning was born on 10th October 1952 at Akyem Bomaa, to Obaapanin Yaa Korang of Agona Royal family (Akem Apapam) and Baffour Kwaku Appeaning (Late Akyem Bomaahene). She grew up in Bomaa, where she received her education at Bomaa Presby Primary 1958 to 1962 up to Kwabeng Presby Middle school and completed in 1970 with Middle School Leaving Certificate. She was academically excellent, angelic voice, very smart and very active in all School Activities. She was the Girls Prefect and member of the school choir. Her spiritual journey began early; she was baptized at the Bomaa Presbyterian Church in 1954 and confirmed in 1970. She was a member of the junior choir and later the main choir, where she nurtured her faith and developed a lifelong devotion to God.

After completing school, Emma remained in Bomaa for some time where Her Elder Sister (Auntie Gyankromaa Mercy) husband (Mr. Kwasi Apenteng) who was then Agric Officer (FA) recruited her into the Agriculture Cocoa Division. It was during this period that she met her beloved husband, the late Mr. Francis Kofi Opoku.

In 1999, she began teaching at Nyamebekyere L/A Basic, where she dedicated herself to the kindergarten learners with patience and love. After some time, she moved into trading, where she continued to work diligently to support her family. .





Emma was known as a brave and intelligent woman, deeply committed to the work of God. She served the Lord wholeheartedly and never took her responsibilities in faith lightly. Her love was profound and her devotion to God and community was unwavering. .

In late 2025, she began to experience slight sickness and underwent treatment. On 18th February 2026, she was taken ill, and in the early hours of Friday, 20th February 2026, the Lord called her home to eternal rest.

Auntie Emma's life was marked by remarkable symmetry and grace. She was a twin, born on a Friday—a day that carries blessings in many traditions. By fate's design, her beloved husband too was a twin and also Friday-born. Their journeys were woven together not only in love but in destiny, and in a way that humbles us all, they both departed this world on a Friday.

This rare alignment reminds us that their bond was more than earthly; it was written in the stars. To know Auntie Emma and her husband was to witness a love story guided by divine timing. Their legacy is not only in the family they nurtured, but in the extraordinary rhythm of their lives—a rhythm that began on a Friday and found its eternal rest on a Friday.

Rest well, dearest mother. Your journey on earth has ended, but your legacy of love will never fade.

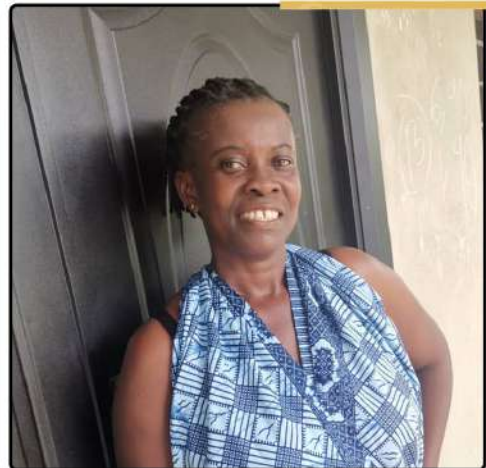
